
The image and quotes above are taken from a series of exhibition panels created by Vikram Parchure. The title of the exhibition is "To the Young".

Vikram is a designer exploring design as an instrument of social change and value education.

Krishnamurti's deep concern for the young led him to exhort youth to insightfully understand that the old ways of problem-solving will prove too inadequate to deal with the complexity of present-day world dilemmas. He said that only a mind that is fresh, youthful, perceptive and ever-willing to face the challenges of uncertainty can deal with this challenge successfully. What makes for such a youthful quality of mind, regardless of the body's physical age? This is the vitally important question that is explored in these panels.

Each KANZ newsletter is presenting one of the panels developed by Vikram for the reader's interest and reflection on the key themes of this exhibition.

Don't Fool Yourself - You Are Conditioned. It's Conditioning That Does The Fooling.



"Our problem is: How is the mind to be set free? And, is it possible to set the mind free –not in layers or patches, not in little bits here and there, but totally, right through, the unconscious as well as the conscious? Or, is the mind ever to be conditioned, ever to be shaped? You have to find out for yourself and not wait for me to tell you whether the mind can ever be free. Can the mind only think about freedom, as a prisoner does, and so is doomed never to be free but always to be held within the bondage of its conditioning?

Do you understand the problem? Can the mind ever be totally free, or is it the very nature of the mind to be conditioned? If it is the fundamental quality of the mind to be limited, then there is no question of ever finding out what is reality; then you can go on repeating that there is God or there is no God, that this is good and something else is bad, all of which is within the pattern of a given culture. But, to find out the truth of the matter, you have to inquire for yourself into whether the mind can really be free. I say it can be, which is not for you to accept or reject. It may be true, or it may be my opinion, my fancy, my illusion. And you cannot base your life on somebody else's discovery, or on his illusion, his fancy, or on a mere idea. You have to find out."

The Ending of Time - a review, part 3



"Emptiness and silence and energy are immense, really immeasurable. But there is something that is - I am using the word "greater" - than that"

(from.chapter 3, "Cleansing the Mind of the Accumulation of Time")

We have been reviewing the book of dialogues between Krishnamurti and Professor David Bohm entitled "The Ending of Time". K's talks and dialogues, over some 60 years, were overwhelmingly concerned with the need of human beings to understand themselves, understand their minds (which are all manifestations of the common human mind). And his words, he often said, were only a mirror in which to do that understanding.

But what makes the dialogues in the Ending of Time unique is that they go beyond what we would normally call self-understanding. They explore the mysterious, the unknown, the metaphysical, areas that underlie human consciousness, and are far vaster. So we find chapters in the book entitled:

- The Ground of Being and the Mind of Man
- Death Has Very Little Meaning
- Cosmic Order

But these mysteries are approached not separately from the human mind, (and are certainly not the mere speculations of thought), but *through* the mind. The distance to the stars, Krishnamurti informs us, is far less than the distance within ourselves. When the me, as time, has ended, K says, there is a sense of "Nothingness". And Nothingness is the entire Universe. From this Nothingness, it is seen that there is a Universal, or Cosmic Mind. And that Mind is part of what might be called "Energy", a living Energy, which is Intelligent.

But still in the dialogues Krishnamurti pushes beyond this Energy. He says that there is a Ground to this emptiness, He refers to it as "The Ground Of All Things". He says everything has a cause, except this Ground, and tentatively uses the word "Absolute". Everything is born from this Ground, and dies back into it.

Interestingly, this concept is now accepted by the scientific community; it stems from Quantum Theory. In fact, one addition of "The Ending of Time" is subtitled: "Where Philosophy and Physics Meet"

Elsewhere in the book K suggests that the significance of his own

existence is that he acted as a conduit between the Ground of all Being, and the human mind. And that, he says, was of far greater importance than all the talks he gave, all the dialogues he participated in, all the books.

"Everything is dying, except that Ground. The Ground has no beginning and no Ending"

The Ending of Time, and many other books, are available from the Krishnamurti Postal Lending Library.


