



*Previously these newsletters have published the content of two public exhibitions focused on the teachings of J. Krishnamurti. "To The Young" and "World In Crisis".*

*These two exhibitions were developed by Vikram Parchure a designer exploring design as an instrument of social change and value education. He had his formal training at the National Institute of Design, Ahmedabad, and has explored design in the context of diverse fields. He has been involved with curriculum design in mainstream and progressive education, the design of learners' aids in adult literacy and non-formal education programmes, the design of conscience raising programmes for the socially oppressed, and the teaching of value education through theatre. He innovated a pilot heritage education programme near Chennai to address issues of cultural alienation in contemporary society.*

*Vikram has developed a third exhibition entitled "The Only Revolution". It has been unable to be exhibited publicly due to restrictions caused by the pandemic. However, a panel from the exhibition will be published each month in this newsletter over the coming months.*

## **Krishnamurti's Notebook – Workshop 3**



Javier Gómez Rodríguez held an online three-part workshop, in September 2021, in collaboration with the Krishnamurti Educational Centre, Canada.

Javier is particularly qualified to talk about Krishnamurti's work and life.

He attended Brockwood Park, England, as a student, and later as a teacher, at a time when Krishnamurti was regularly in dialogue with the school.

Each workshop starts with a talk by Javier, about one aspect of "Krishnamurti's Notebook", followed by a question and answer session.

"Krishnamurti's Notebook" is different from other Krishnamurti books in that it presents a description, of the state of his consciousness, and therefore provides direct insight into Krishnamurti's teachings .

## Is God an invention of thought?




*"What is religion? Man has sought something that is not of this world. From the most ancient of people till now man has sought something that time, thought, has nothing to do with that. He has sought it. And in his search, he has been trapped by the priests. Priests of the world who become the interpreters of that - we know, you don't, we will tell you all about it. And the established religions are just nonsense - please don't accept this. For the speaker, they are just entertainment, excitement, the thing to do for a while. If you are young you avoid all that nonsense. As you grow older you get frightened, you become this or that. And all the things that are in the churches, temples, and mosques are put together by thought."*



**Fourth Conversation with Alan Naude**  
**Masters and Hierarchy**



This conversation with Alain Naudé is titled 'masters and hierarchy'. Alain Naude was Krishnamurti's private secretary in the 1960s. He met Krishnamurti in 1963 whilst a music lecturer at Pretoria University and a professional concert pianist. He gave up his teaching and performing in 1964 to work with Krishnamurti. Fluent in several languages, he was very helpful at international gatherings and in attracting younger audiences to Krishnamurti's talks at a time of cultural change in the West.

This fourth conversation between Naude and Krishnamurti was recorded in January 1972. Naude begins by asking about masters. 'One finds in various teachings the idea of masters, conscious entities who work for the good of mankind. Is there a reservoir of wisdom? Do such entities exist, or does man want to have myths?' Krishnamurti responds that there is a reservoir of goodness and a reservoir of violence and asks whether there is something which is not these two, that is beyond these two? Is your mind capable of not being held in the reservoirs of goodness or violence?


When you understand these two opposites and go beyond them, meditation is not in terms of vision or action, but the state of silence which is then operating, an energy which then flows. That energy has no character. When one asks, 'Is there a hierarchy,

a master, a group of evolved entities?' you are asking from a point of view, or from desire, from hope. What is the relationship between the current of vulgarity and that which is beyond and above the opposites?

## Krishnamurti Postal Lending Library Book Review



Krishnamurti said:

*"We do not want to know what death is; we do not want to know the extraordinary miracle, the beauty, the depth, the vastness of death. We don't want to inquire into that something which we don't know. All we want is to continue".*

The book "On Living and Dying" reveals that the fear of death is not rooted in physical pain, or in leaving loved ones, but in the fear that some essential part of what we are will not continue. Krishnamurti explains that to comprehend death, which is so inseparably joined with life, we must come to it with a fresh understanding, free of learned attitude and preconceptions. On Living and Dying is a thematic selection from the seminars over Krishnamurti's entire lifetime, drawing on talks from Bombay to Amsterdam, and London to Seattle, progressing from the
